Happy New Year! We look back with appreciation for all the progress our community made together in 2024 and we look forward to a very successful 2025! It truly takes a village to make progress. We are grateful to our dedicated employees, emergency services, devoted volunteers and board members, school administration, teachers and staff, coaches, veteran organizations, local businesses, churches, and all our residents for working together to make Little Ferry the great town that it is! No matter if you lived here for decades or you just recently moved into town, we all quickly come to know Little Ferry as “the small town with the BIG heart.” Together we share the responsibility of looking out for one another, lending a helping hand, and keeping our community safe and clean. This year we look to some exciting developments in town as we officially open our new Recreation Center at the old Sokol Hall on Main Street. The building of the new pump station on Liberty Street will finally be ready to be in operation after over a year of work by the NJ DEP Rebuild by Design team. This will help further mitigate flooding issues in areas of our community and will be a welcome improvement. The construction of the new Washington School should also begin in the Summer! The voters of Little Ferry, at the recommendation of the Board of Education, approved a bond referendum in March of 2024 to raise the funds for construction. Although construction will take nearly two years, the start of this project is a historic moment for Little Ferry! We will continue our road improvement program at an even faster pace. Over 75 percent of our roads, curbs, sidewalks and drainage have been improved since we began this program nearly a decade ago and we plan on completing every area of the Borough. We also hope to break ground on a new Pickleball Court and improve our Shannon Dalton Forde Softball field on Mehrhof Road.

Together with my colleagues on the Borough Council, Ronald Anzalone, George Muller, Peggy Steinhilber, Stephen Lanum, Jenifer Lange and Alex Enrique, we thank you for the great privilege of your trust as we serve the community we all love. We believe now more than ever if we all continue to unite together and work together as a community, our best days are ahead of us. We wish you a very Happy, Healthy, and Prosperous New Year!

What YOU Can Do To Prevent Underage Drinking

- Eat dinner together regularly.
- Be caring and supportive.
- Maintain open lines of communication.
- Set no-drinking rules and consequences. Be consistent with them.
- Surround your child with positive role models.
- Teens need parents to be parents, not drinking partners.
- Keep track of the alcohol in your home. Count it and lock it up.
- Check in with your teens about their plans and ask about alcohol.
- Be up and ready at curfew; talk with your teens about their night.
- Learn the signs and symptoms of alcohol abuse. If problems occur, get help promptly.

A standard drink is defined as 12 ounces of beer, 8 or 9 ounces of malt liquor, 5 ounces of wine, or 1.5 ounces of distilled spirits, which contain the same amount of alcohol.

ALCOHOL FACTS

The legal drinking age in the USA is 21. Drinking and driving is against the law – call for a ride!

Talk to your child about underage drinking. As children mature, it is natural for them to assert their independence, seek new challenges, and engage in risky behavior. Underage drinking is one such behavior that attracts many adolescents. They may want to try alcohol but often do not fully recognize its effects on their health and behavior. Other reasons youth drink alcohol include peer pressure, increased independence or the desire for it and stress.

Borough Ordinances

Pursuant to Borough Code, the following ordinances will be enforced.

1. Not permissible – Airbnb, Vrbo or Short-Term Rentals
2. Construction and Landscapers permissible Mondays through Saturdays 8am to 8pm
3. Property Maintenance – properties must be maintained, mowed and cleared of snow
4. Permit required for tree removal, garage sales, and dumpsters
5. All dogs must be licensed at Borough Hall and leashed while on public property
6. Dog waste on all public property must be picked up immediately
7. Certificate of Resale required for all properties to be sold
8. Certificate of Rental required for all properties to be rented
9. Lead inspections are required for all rental properties built prior to 1978

Flood Insurance

Homeowner insurance policies typically do not provide coverage for flood-related damages. However, flood insurance is accessible to all property owners through FEMA, including those whose properties have previously been affected by flooding. Due to Little Ferry's involvement in the Community Rating System (CRS), property owners who participate in the flood insurance program are eligible for a premium discount. Furthermore, some financial institutions may require property owners to obtain flood insurance as a prerequisite for securing a new mortgage or home improvement loan. These insurance policies usually cover only the structure of the building, leaving personal contents vulnerable, especially during severe flooding incidents. It is imperative to verify that you have sufficient coverage. Little Ferry is committed to offering essential flood information to our community through FEMA. Our Construction Official, Keith Dalton, also holds the position of Floodplain Manager. Should you have any concerns regarding flooding, please reach out to our Building Department and ask for Keith at 201-641-2942 or www.fema.gov. Being proactive about flood risks, hazards, and mitigation options is of utmost importance.

SANITATION/RECYCLING INFORMATION GUIDE

HOURS: Monday - Friday 7:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m.

Owners/Occupants of every dwelling must have adequate covered containers for holding garbage, grass and recyclables.

Containers must be accessible for safe collection.

NO RESIDENT SHALL PLACE REFUSE AT THE CURB BEFORE 6:00 P.M. ON THE DAY PRIOR TO SCHEDULED COLLECTION,

NO LATER THAN 6:00 A.M. ON THE SCHEDULED COLLECTION DAY.

NO RECEPTACLES SHALL BE LEFT AT THE CURB AFTER 7:00 P.M. ON THE DAY OF THE SCHEDULED CURBSIDE COLLECTION.

BULK TRASH ITEMS - Total of three (3) items such as sofas, chairs, tables, rugs and similar materials that are not recyclable are to be separated from regular garbage and placed at curb on Monday garbage pickup day. Carpeting and rugs must be cut into four-foot lengths and tied in bundles not to exceed fifty pounds.

CURBSIDE RECYCLING REQUIREMENTS

RECYCLABLE MATERIALS MUST BE OUT PRIOR TO 6:00 A.M. ON THE MORNING OF PICK UP.

Paper (newspapers, magazines, books) and cardboard. Cardboard must be collapsed. Paper must be tied put in paper bags or in small cardboard boxes not exceeding 50 pounds. Paper and cardboard can now be combined and will be picked up in one trip using the above methods. **SEE CALENDAR FOR PICK UP DAY. CO-MINGLED RECYCLING** - All plastic, glass, tin, aluminum and metal cans and bottles should be combined together in containers by the curb - we do not accept styrofoam or plastic bags. **SEE CALENDAR FOR PICK UP DAY.**

TREE BRANCHES & LOGS. Pick up season - April 14th through October 31st.

Branches will be chipped up to 4 inches in diameter and 12 feet long. Logs must be cut to no longer than 16 inches. This service applies to only Tree Trimming and NOT TREE REMOVAL. Residents must call (201) 641-1140 to notify DPW. Tree removal contractors must remove (by law) any and all debris from job.

CHRISTMAS TREE PICKUP - Leave at curb Jan. 2nd - Jan. 31st

NO DECORATIONS LEFT ON TREE

GRASS AND GARDEN DEBRIS - (No Rocks! No Dirt!) are picked up every Tuesday, except after a Holiday when it will be Wednesday, April 1st thru October 28th for the entire town. These items are to be put into resident owned, covered containers with handles only. (Must not weigh more than 50 lbs.) **NO PLASTIC BAGS OR LEAF BAGS.**

LEAF BAG PICK UP - During the fall leaf season, October 14th through December 16th (No branches or twigs) bags may be left by curb for pickup. FREE biodegradable bags are only available to all homeowners at D.P.W. garage starting October 10th through November 25th. All landscapers are required to remove, (by law), all grass, leaves and yard waste from any and all homes and properties they contract with.

WHITE GOODS - And large metal items - boilers, washers, dryers, hot water heaters, stoves, refrigerators (doors removed) and all aluminum and metal will be picked up by appointment only. CALL (201) 641-0023 OR (201) 641-1140.

ITEMS TO BE BROUGHT TO THE DPW FOR RECYCLING

NO HOUSEHOLD GARBAGE, FURNITURE OR CARPETING IS ACCEPTED AT THE RECYCLING YARD. Recycling Yard Hours: 7:30 am to 2:45 pm

BUILDING MATERIALS - Homeowners may bring small amounts of building material from improvement projects that are done by them. No contractors or contractors' vehicles are permitted in the Recycling Yard. Construction materials include but are not limited to: wood, paneling, sheetrock, cabinets, doors, moldings, formica, etc. We do not accept concrete, bricks, asphalt or dirt. It is the responsibility of the homeowner to dispose of large amounts by private hauler. We do not offer a curbside pickup of these materials. You must call 201-641-1140 before bringing materials to the recycling yard.

USED CLOTHING - Please deposit in containers outside the senior building or at soccer field.

USED MOTOR OIL, BATTERIES & TIRES - Must be brought to the D.P.W. Garage during working hours only.

ELECTRONIC ITEMS - all types including TV's, computers, monitors, etc., must be brought to the DPW during working hours only.

HAZARDOUS MATERIALS. Call D.P.W. 201-641-1140 for County Collection Dates or visit www.bcua.org for more information.

NOTE: The recycling drop off center will be open only during D.P.W. working hours. The center will be closed for lunch from 11:45 a.m. to 12:30 p.m. and after hours and weekends.

NO GARBAGE OR DEBRIS IS TO BE DUMPED AFTER HOURS ANYWHERE IN THE D.P.W. COMPLEX. ANYONE CAUGHT DOING SO WILL BE SUBJECT TO ILLEGAL DUMPING FINES OF \$1,000.00 as per ordinance.

ALL CLEANOUTS OF A HOUSE OR APARTMENT IS THE RESPONSIBILITY OF THE OWNER OF THE PROPERTY. The DPW nor the Borough's trash hauler will not take any large amounts of debris/trash. You must dispose of it on your own or get a dumpster and permit from the Borough. The DPW is a recycling center, we do not accept furniture, mattresses, tables, rugs etc.

SNOW REMOVAL - When snowfall is 3 inches or deeper, all Borough streets will be plowed curb to curb. No parking on streets when snow covered (**as per Boro Ordinance#7-10**) and no throwing snow back into roadways (**as per Boro Ordinance#23-3.1**).



Recycling & Sanitation Tips

PAPER (NEWSPAPERS, MAGAZINES, BOOKS) AND CARDBOARD are picked up every other Wednesday. These items must be **FREE** from packaging materials and debris. Pizza boxes are **NOT** recyclable due to their oil content. Cardboard is to be collapsed. Newspaper should be tied up or placed in a paper bag. Plastic bags are unacceptable and will not be picked up.

BOTTLES, CANS AND GLASS are picked up every other Wednesday. These items should be emptied and thoroughly rinsed. They can be comingled and should be placed at the curb in an open-top garbage can or recycling container. Please keep them free of water. **Plastic bags are unacceptable** and recyclables will not be picked up.

WHITE GOODS/METAL are picked up at the curb or may be brought to the recycling yard. Call for a pickup appointment.

VEGETATIVE WASTE (GRASS, LEAVES AND GARDEN DEBRIS) is picked up every Tuesday. Please see calendar. Must be placed in an open garbage can or biodegradable paper bag. **Plastic bags are unacceptable** and will not be collected.

TREE BRANCHES must be chipped at the curbside. Call for an appointment. This service is for tree trimming, not cutting down whole trees done by the homeowner, **not for excessive amounts of tree branches**. Contractors must remove whatever they cut.

ELECTRONICS must be dropped off at the recycling yard during business hours. DEP/EPA regulations will not allow a curbside pickup on these items. This includes but is not limited to televisions.

HOUSEHOLD GARBAGE must be placed at the curb no earlier than 7PM the night before collection or by 5AM the day of collection. Garbage is picked up Monday and Thursday. Garbage is to be placed in containers no larger than 32 gallons with detachable lids.

BULK GARBAGE, FURNITURE AND CARPETING is reserved for the **Monday** pickup. There is a limit of three pieces of furniture at a time. Carpet and padding must be cut into 4 foot lengths and rolled up.

CONSTRUCTION DEBRIS may be dropped off at the recycling center in small amounts. This is for the homeowner doing small improvements themselves. A strict limit of one level pickup truckload. Amounts exceeding this limit are the responsibility of the homeowner to dispose of. **NO CONCRETE, BRICK OR BLACKTOP. You may not make multiple trips.**

NO CONTRACTORS, LANDSCAPERS OR COMMERCIAL VEHICLES ARE PERMITTED IN THE RECYCLING YARD.

ANYTHING LEFT AT THE GATE OF THE RECYCLING YARD AFTER HOURS WILL BE CONSIDERED ILLEGAL DUMPING. AS PER BOROUGH ORDINANCE ILLEGAL DUMPING CARRIES A FINE OF \$1,000.00 AND WILL BE STRICTLY ENFORCED.
